STATUS OF UGANDA MALARIA PROJECT: The following are excerpts from Father Frederick Tusingire's recent report: "The Malaria Project is doing wonders for many people. With the money received in 2016 the Good Hope Health Clinic continued to supply malaria medicine to all the poor people who came to the clinic, especially the widows, orphans, pregnant women and children. Mosquito nets continued to be distributed and as part of the public health campaign, people were educated on preventive measures against malaria. We helped pay the medical bills of poor children attending St. Theresa's school which is next to the health unit. As well we helped transport sick patients to and from the health unit. With the funds raised in 2017 we will continue this work and in addition we will acquire the chemicals and equipment necessary for the accurate diagnosis of the malaria infection. On behalf of the many people who are benefitting from this project, I would like to thank the members of Our Lady of Perpetual Help parish for their support of this initiative.
